FOUNDING STORY

As Baby Boomers aged into retirement, the population of LGBT older adults increased significantly. This brought about questions like - what do culturally competent services for LGBT seniors look like and how would the unique needs of this community be addressed?

In 2010, the Center for Advocacy for the Rights & Interests of the Elderly (CARIE) in collaboration with a few queer organizations set out to answer these questions. Together, they assembled a group of volunteers to hit the streets and survey LGBT older adults during Philadelphia Pride. The survey used a series of questions to better understand what aging concerns LGBT people were experiencing and revealed the top concerns of the community were physical health, emotional wellbeing, cultural competence of service staff, safe/affordable housing, and legal services.

The survey led to the LGBT Senior Summit which opened the conversation to include organizations, community members, government agencies, and professionals in the field of aging! As the summit concluded, a set of recommendations were made for how to address each of the areas of concern and with that, the LGBT Elder Initiative was formed.

This year marks a decade since the survey was conducted, the summit was held, and the LGBT Elder Initiative started work to support the needs of LGBT older adults. In that time we have accomplished so much including increased access to culturally competent housing, the development of an HIV and aging community advisory committee, the creation of free community programs to address topics like aging in place and mental health, and much more!

While there are many more resources available to the LGBT community today than there were 10 years ago, we still have a lot of work to do. Our team of staff and volunteers at the LGBT Elder Initiative will continue to fight for our LGBT older adults and work to ensure they have the opportunity to live vibrant, creative, and mutually supportive lives!

And we have a vast range of homecare agencies, senior living facilities, insurers, managed care organizations, healthcare institutions, and corporate allies showing their support.

We see your sponsorship not as a one-time financial commitment, but as a message that you and your agencies are fully committing to effectively serving our LGBT elder communities and ensuring LGBT equity within your organizations. 

Created free community programs on topics including: long-term care, Alzheimer's and dementia, elder abuse, end-of-life planning, grief and loss, caregiving, community engagement, Medicare, aging in place, mental health, sex and intimacy, nutrition, and more.

Through partnership with Jefferson Health, launched "Doctor Is In" series in 2018 offering free monthly health workshops.

19 programs offered since 2018. Covered topics including: cardiovascular health, hypertension, diabetes, stroke prevention, dementia, cancer screenings, falls prevention, osteoporosis, pain management, depression, and exercise.

Developed an HIV & Aging Community Advisory Committee of individuals age 50+ living with HIV. Since forming in 2015, have planned and implemented 35 programs on topics related to aging with HIV.

Published over 100 columns in the Philadelphia Gay News on topics related to LGBT aging.

Presented on LGBT aging issues at national conferences of American Society on Aging, National Council on Aging, and National Institute of Senior Centers.

Developed relationships with Philadelphia Corporation for Aging (PCA) to expand LGBT inclusivity of county's Area Agency on Aging. Represented on PCA Advisory Committee. Have served on a task force addressing HIV prevention for older adults and a task force addressing LGBT cultural competence in senior centers. Collaborated to provide community health workshops on managing chronic health conditions.

Pioneered collaborative programming with senior centers in Philadelphia to integrate LGBT content into senior center programming and to connect LGBT elders to LGBT-friendly senior centers.

Collaborated with the Pennsylvania Department of Aging to improve the inclusivity of the state unit on aging. Worked with the Department to recruit planning committee and oversee coordination of the 2018 LGBTQ Aging Summit, attended by over 300+ professionals and community members from across the Commonwealth.

Advocated for LGBTQ older Pennsylvanians through several statewide commissions including the Pennsylvania Long-Term Care Commission, the Governor's LGBTQ Workgroup, the Managed Long-Term Services and Supports Committee, and the Governor's Commission on LGBTQ Affairs.


Worked with the Governor's Commission on LGBTQ Affairs to form a statewide LGBTQ Aging Workgroup to advise state government on policy issues impacting LGBT older Pennsylvanians.

Created strong relationships with aging services organizations that helped them to become more LGBT-friendly, and with LGBT-serving organizations to help them become more age-friendly.



JIMMY

MEET JIMMY, A LONG TIME BUDDY WITH ACTIONWELLNESS,
A RETIRED WEB DESIGNER, AND A VOLUNTEER ON THE LGBT ELDER
INITIATIVE'S HIV & AGING COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE!



Jimmy's story started more than 30 years ago when his partner tested positive for HIV. After receiving his diagnosis, Jimmy's partner had to be admitted into a psychiatric hospital. When he was released, his partner wanted to make sure that no one else had to endure the same experience he had, so he began training with ActionAIDS (now ActionWellness) to become a buddy for people living with HIV. Unfortunately, he got sick shortly after he finished training and never got the chance to be a buddy to others.

Jimmy's partner passed in 1990 and after some time, Jimmy joined ActionAIDS as a buddy to

continue what his late-partner had started years prior. Today, 30 years later, he continues to support others living with HIV through ActionWellness and through our HIV & Aging Community Advisory Committee (CAC).

Jimmy was first introduced to the LGBT Elder Initiative by founding board chair, Heshie Zinman! Heshie had known Jimmy's background and experience and invited him to join the CAC, a group of individuals 55+ living with HIV who work together to support the Elder Initiative's HIV & Aging programming including Thrivers, a peer support and discussion group for long-term survivors of HIV. After learning about the Elder Initiative's mission and the CAC, Jimmy joined the Elder Initiative as a volunteer!




